

If a child is in immediate danger Call 911

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE IS NOT AVAILABLE THROUGH THIS WEB SITE

In an emergency, call 911 or your local emergency number immediately from any wired or wireless phone.

An emergency is any situation that requires immediate assistance from the police, fire department or ambulance. Examples include:

- Assault resulting in serious injury
- Sexual assault
- Sexual offense
- Rape
- Kidnapping
- Indecent liberties with a minor
- Assault involving the use of a weapon
- Possession of a firearm in violation of the law
- Possession of a weapon in violation of the law
- Possession of a controlled substance in violation of the law

Important: If you're not sure whether the situation is a true emergency, officials recommend calling 911 and letting the call-taker determine whether you need emergency help.

Failure to report, or a delay in reporting, can have serious consequences for the district as a whole and can also interfere with a criminal case.

When a serious crime occurs on [school property](#), it's essential that the following protocols are followed:

- Elementary schools, which do not have a school resource officer on campus, need to notify CMS Police when a serious criminal act occurs. **Call 980-343-6030 to notify CMS Police**, and someone there will notify the appropriate agency. In cases of life-threatening emergencies, 911 should always be called first.
- For middle and high schools, which do have school resource officers, principals or their designees can notify the school resource officer, who will in turn notify the appropriate agency.
- For middle and high schools: After you have notified your school resource officer, call 980-343-6030 to advise them of the criminal act.
